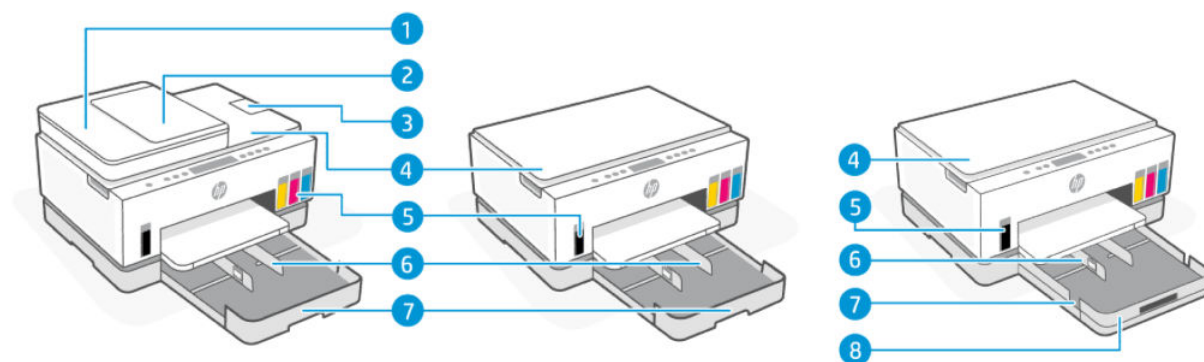

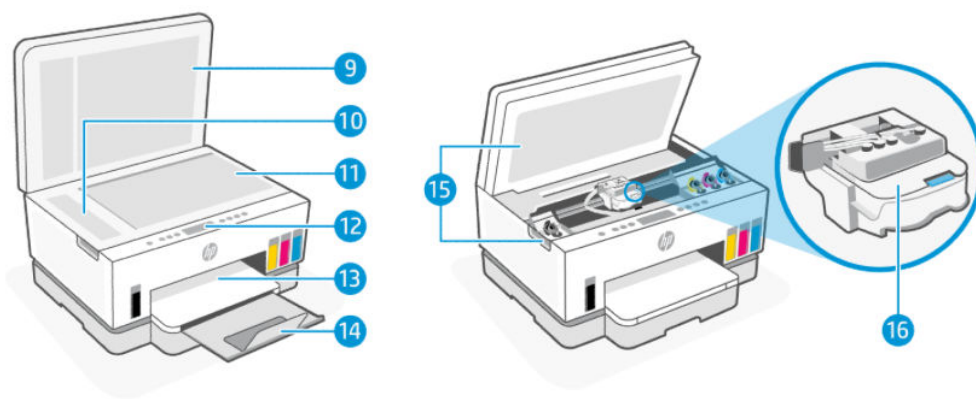

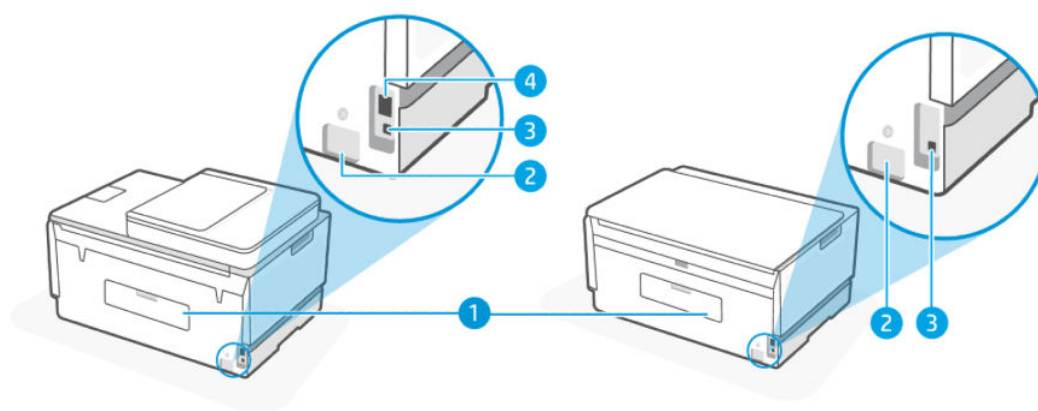

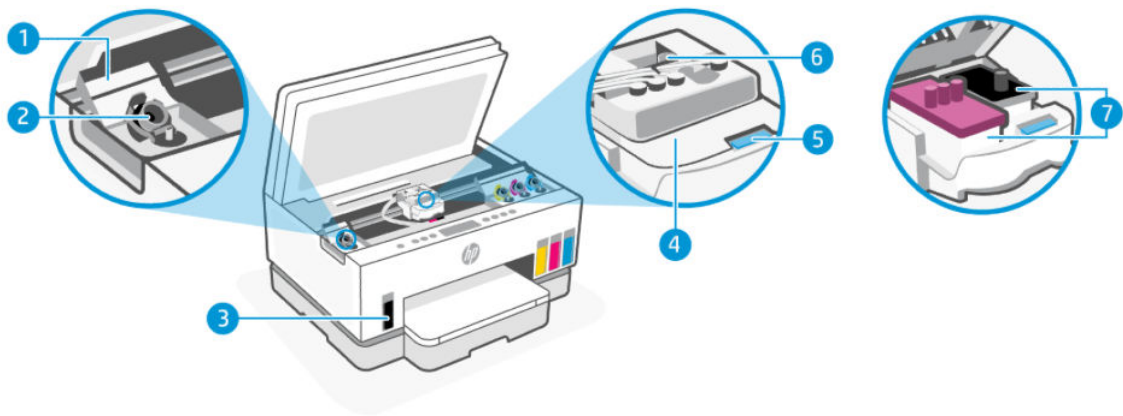

Feature	Description
1	Tank covers Tank covers enclose the ink tanks on both sides of the printer.
2	Tank caps Tank caps are plugs to seal the opening of the ink tanks.
3	Ink tanks There are four ink tanks. Each tank contains a different colored ink: black, yellow, magenta, and cyan.
4	Printhead cover The printhead cover on the print carriage secures the printheads in the carriage. Make sure the printhead cover is properly closed to avoid problems such as carriage jams. CAUTION: After you have set up the printer, do not open the printhead cover unless instructed to do so.
5	Printhead cover button Press to open the printhead cover. CAUTION: After you have set up the printer, do not open the printhead cover unless instructed to do so.

Table 1-4 Printer inner view (continued)

Feature	Description
6	Ink tubes button Press to disconnect the ink tubes. To prevent ink leaks or printer damage, you must disconnect the ink tubes when moving the printer to a different location outside of your home or office after initial setup.
7	Printheads The printheads are the components in the print mechanism that apply ink to the paper. There are two printheads: a color printhead and a black printhead. Printheads alignment is a process of aligning the printheads to improve print quality. See Improve print quality .

This topic describes the printer control panel features.

Overview of buttons and lights

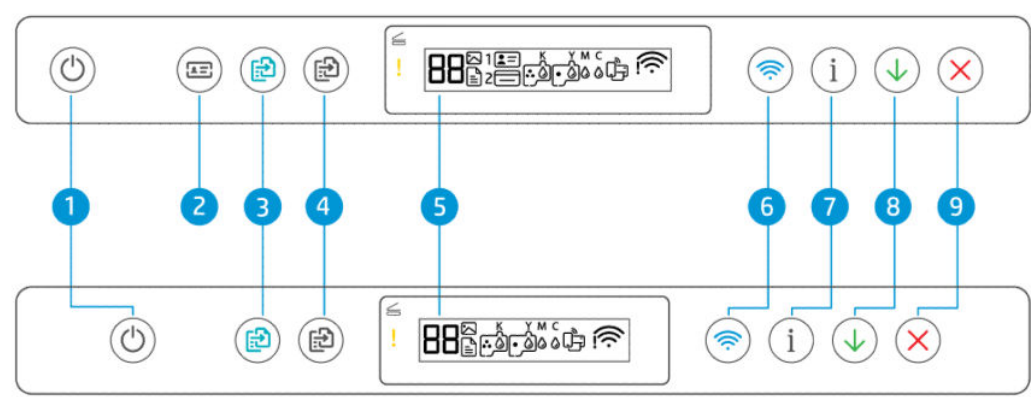


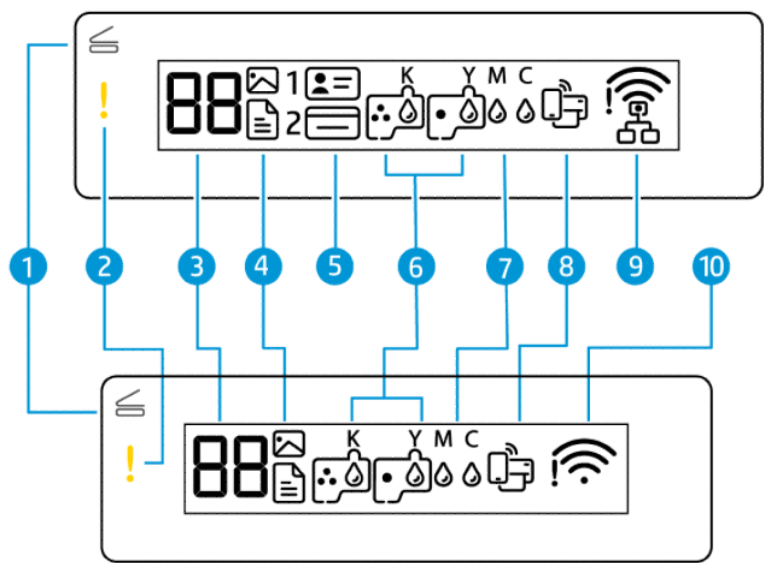
Table 1-5 Overview of buttons and lights

Feature	Button	Description
1	Power button 	Turn the printer on or off.
2	ID Copy button (some printer models) 	The ID Copy feature allows you to place a card or small-size document anywhere on the scanner glass to copy both sides onto the same page. See Copy an identification (ID) card (some printer models) .
3	Color Copy button 	Start a color copy job. To increase the number of copies, press and hold the button or press it multiple times. Copying starts 2 seconds after the last button press.

Table 1-5 Overview of buttons and lights (continued)

Feature	Button	Description
4	Black Copy button 	Start a black-and-white copy job. To increase the number of copies, press and hold the button or press it multiple times. Copying starts 2 seconds after the last button press.
5	Control panel display 	Shows the number counter or error codes, different copy modes, issues relating to ink, printheads, or paper, and the network connection status. For more information on the display icons and error codes, see Understand control panel lights and display icons.
6	Wi-Fi button 	Turn on or off the wireless capability of the printer. See Wi-Fi status, light, and icons.
7	Information button 	Print an information page. The information page provides a summary of the printer information and its current status (including network, Wi-Fi Direct, Web Services, ink, and so on).
8	Resume button 	Resume a job after a disruption (for example, after loading paper or clearing a paper jam).
9	Cancel button 	Stop the current operation.

Feature	Icon	Description
1	 Open Lid light	This light turns on in one of the following situations: • ID Copy mode (some printer models): Open the scanner lid, flip the card, and then press the copy button that is blinking or lit to copy and print. See Copy an identification (ID) card (some printer models). • During printheads alignment: Open the scanner lid, place the printed alignment page print-side down on the scanner glass, and then press the blinking copy button to scan the page. See Printheads alignment icon.
2	 Attention light	Indicates an error or warning state.
3	 Number Counter icon	Shows the number counter when you are copying documents, changes to the letter A when the printer is doing printheads alignment, and shows the letter E and a number when the printer is in an error state. See Control panel error codes .
4	 Document icon  Photo icon	The Document icon appears when the printer is in Document Copy mode, for copying on plain paper. If the Attention light is on or blinking, it also indicates paper related errors. See Document icon and paper errors . The Photo icon appears when the printer is in Photo Copy mode, for copying on photo paper. To switch between the two modes, see Perform common tasks on the printer control panel .

Feature	Icon	Description
5	ID Copy Front and ID Copy Back icons (some printer models)  	Indicates the side of the card to place on the scanner glass.
6	Printhead icons 	A flashing left icon indicates an error related to the color printhead. A flashing right icon indicates an error related to the black printhead.
7	KYMC and Ink icons 	The KYMC letters and Ink drops are used to indicate status of the four ink tanks in the printer. Each set of icons corresponds to an ink tank: black, yellow, magenta, and cyan.
8	Wi-Fi Direct icon 	Indicates the current Wi-Fi Direct status. - On: Wi-Fi Direct is turned on and ready to use. - Off: Wi-Fi Direct is off. See To turn Wi-Fi Direct on or off.
9	Ethernet icon (Ethernet model only) 	- On: Indicates that the printer is connected to the network through a wired (Ethernet) connection. - Off: No Ethernet cable is connected to the Ethernet port on the printer, or the printer cannot detect the cable. - Blinks: The printer is connected to an active Ethernet cable, but is not connected to a network. See Fix Ethernet connection issues (some printer models).
10	Wi-Fi status icons 	Shows the Wi-Fi status and signal strength. See Wi-Fi status, light, and icons. To resolve wireless connection issues, see Network and connection issues.

Understand control panel lights and display icons

This topic describes the printer control panel features.

Control panel error codes

This topic describes the error codes on the printer display.

If the Number Counter icon on the printer display changes to a letter E and a number, the printer is in an error state. The letter E and the number work as error codes.

Table 1-7 Control panel error codes

Error code	Cause	Solution
E1/E2	Paper size mismatch (E1) or Paper length mismatch (E2) has occurred. When printing, the printer detects that the paper size of the printing job does not match the width or length of the paper loaded.	1. Press the Cancel button  to cancel printing. 2. Load paper that matches the size of the page you want to print, or change the paper size settings in your application to match the size of the paper you are using. 3. Print the document again. To change the paper size, see Change the paper settings from the embedded web server (EWS).
E3	The carriage inside the printer has stalled.	1. Lift the ink access door. 2. Make sure the printhead cover is properly closed and the print carriage is not obstructed. Do not open the printhead cover. 3. Remove any jammed paper or other objects blocking the carriage. 4. Close the ink access door. 5. Press the Resume button  to continue printing or press the Cancel button . For more information, see Jams and paper-feed issues.
E4	There is a paper jam.	Clear the jam, and then press the Resume button  to continue printing. For more information, see Jams and paper-feed issues. CAUTION: Do not open the printhead cover.
E5	The scanner is not working.	Turn the printer off, and then on again. If the problem persists, contact HP. The printer can still print even if the scanner is not working.
E6	The printer is in an error state.	Restart the printer. 1. Turn off the printer. 2. Unplug the power cord. 3. Wait a minute, and then plug the power cord back in. 4. Turn on the printer. If the problem persists, contact HP.
E7	One or more ink tanks are out of ink.	Refill the indicated ink tank that is out of ink. See To refill the ink tanks .
E8	Fatal error.	Turn the printer off, and then on again. If the problem persists, contact HP.
E9	Firmware update error.	Turn the printer off, and then on again. If the problem persists, contact HP.

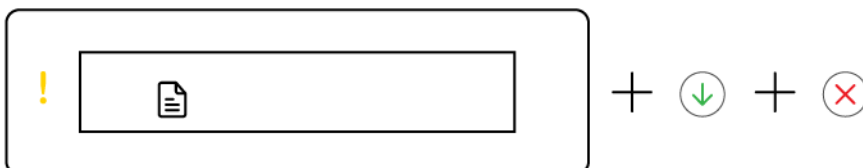
Power button light



Status	Cause and Solution
On	The printer is on.
Off	The printer is powered off.
Dimmed	The printer is in Sleep mode. See Sleep mode .
Blinking	The printer is turning on or off, or processing a job. To cancel the job, press the Cancel button  .
Fast blinking	If the ink access door is open, close it. If the ink access door is closed and the light is blinking fast, the printer is in an error state. Check your computer or device for any messages that can help provide more information. If need, try printing a page to generate an onscreen message.

Document icon and paper errors

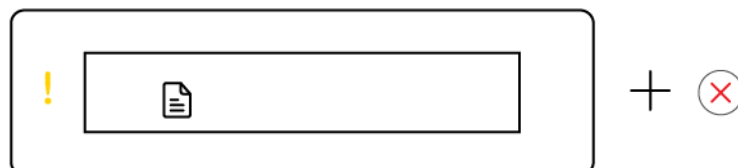

- The Attention light and Document icon are blinking.

The Resume light and Cancel light are on.

Cause	Solution
The printer receives a printing job, and detects that there is no paper in the input tray.	Load paper, and then press the Resume button  to continue printing. See Load paper .

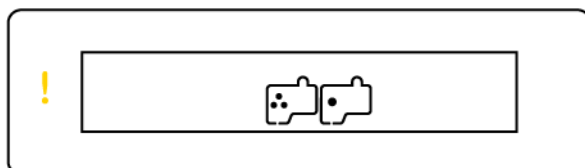


- The Attention light and Document icon are blinking.

The Resume light is off. The Cancel light could be on.

Cause	Solution
There is a paper jam in the document feeder, or the original is not inserted properly into the document feeder.	If the Cancel light is on, press the Cancel button  .
NOTE: The document feeder is only available in some printer models.	For more information, see Jams and paper-feed issues and To load an original in the document feeder (some printer models) .

Printhead icons and errors



- The Attention light and one or both the Printhead icons are blinking.

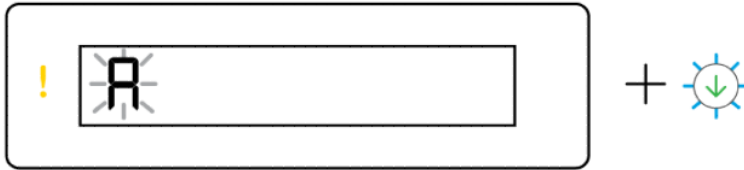
Cause	Solution
One of the following might have occurred:	• Make sure both printheads are properly installed.
• One or both printheads are missing. • One or both printheads are installed incorrectly. • One or both printheads still have an orange plug or plastic tape on them. • One or both printheads are incompatible or damaged.	• Install any missing printhead. • If both printheads are installed, remove the printhead indicated, make sure there is no orange plug or plastic tape on it, and then reinsert the printhead securely. • Make sure that you are using the correct HP printheads for your printer.

	NOTE: Do not open the printhead cover unless instructed to do so.

Printheads alignment icon



- The Number Counter icon shows an A or a blinking A, or a “racecourse animation”.

Cause	Solution
The printer is doing printheads alignment.	After the alignment page is printed and the Open Lid light  blinks, place the printed page print-side down on the scanner glass, close the scanner lid, and then press the blinking copy button to scan the page.
A racecourse animation appears on the display when the printer is printing a printheads alignment page.	
A solid "A" appears when the alignment page is printed.	Printheads alignment is complete after the scan.
A blinking "A" appears when the printer is scanning the alignment page.	To load an original, see Load paper .
"A" disappears after the scan when printheads alignment is complete.	

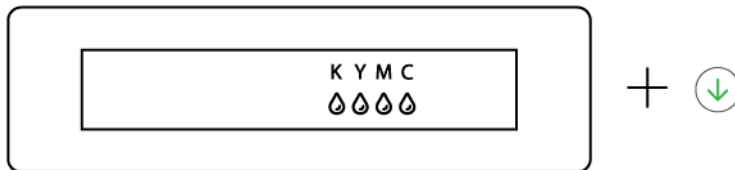


- The Number Counter icon shows a blinking A. The Attention light and Resume light are blinking.

Cause	Solution
Printheads alignment failed. This occurs after you have scanned the alignment page.	Try one of the following: • Press one of the copy buttons to rescan the alignment page. • Press the Resume button  to reprint the alignment page. If you do not do anything, printheads alignment gets canceled after some time.

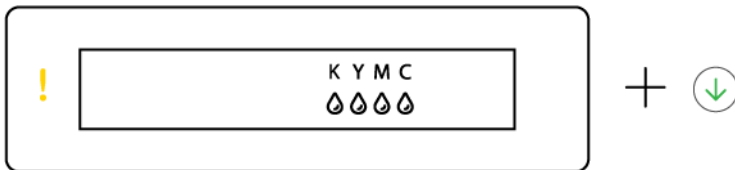

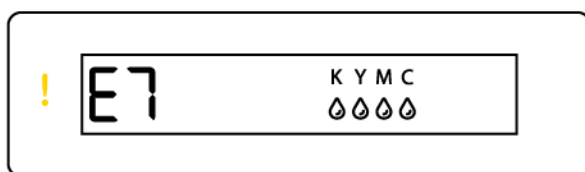

- The Attention light, error code E7, and one or more Ink icons are blinking.

Cause	Solution
One or more ink tanks are out of ink.	Refill the indicated ink tank.

Wi-Fi status, light, and icons

The Wi-Fi light and the wireless status icons on the control panel display work together to indicate the status of a wireless connection.

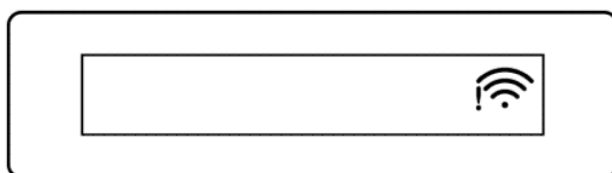

On	 On	The printer is connected to a Wi-Fi network.

Blinks	 On (signal bars cycle)	The printer is unable to connect to a Wi-Fi network. To resolve wireless connection issues, see Network and connection issues .

Perform common tasks on the printer control panel

To turn on or off the wireless capability of the printer

When the wireless capability of the printer is turned on, the Wi-Fi button on the printer control panel should be lit.

- If the blue Wi-Fi light is off, press the Wi-Fi button  to turn it on.
- To turn off the Wi-Fi function, press the button again.

To enter Wi-Fi Protected Setup (WPS) Push Button mode

- Press and hold the Wi-Fi button  for at least 3 seconds.

 **NOTE:** For the other tasks listed in the following table, be sure to place the printer in support mode before using any button combinations.

To enter the printer support mode

- Press and hold the Information button  for at least 5 seconds.

All button lights on the printer control panel will light up.

To exit the printer support mode

- Press the Cancel button .

All button lights will turn off if there are no printer errors.

Table 1-9 Common tasks from the printer control panel

Task	Instructions (must be in support mode)
Turn Wi-Fi Direct on or off	Press the Wi-Fi button  and the Resume button  at the same time.

Switch between Document Copy and Photo Copy modes	Press and hold the Black Copy button  and the Color Copy button  at the same time for 3 seconds.

Restore factory defaults	Restoring the printer to factory defaults will remove all settings and functions previously set up on the printer. With the ink access door open, press and hold the Information button  and the Cancel button  for at least 3 seconds.

Print reports from the printer control panel

This topic describes the printer reports and how to print.

To print the printer information page

From the printer control panel, press the Information button .

The information page provides a summary of the printer information and its current status (including network, Wi-Fi Direct, Web Services, ink, and so on).

To print other reports

1. From the printer control panel, place the printer in the support mode. To do so, press and hold the Information button  for 5 seconds until the control panel buttons light up.
2. See the following instructions to print the desired report.

Table 1-10 Print reports

Printer report	Description	How to print (must be in support mode)
Printer Status Report	The page provides a summary of the printer information, current status, and settings, including connectivity settings, as well as print or scan settings and usage.	Press the Resume button  .
Wi-Fi Network Test Report and Network Configuration Page	Wireless Network Test Report shows the diagnostics results for the status of the Wi-Fi network, Wi-Fi signal strength, detected networks, and more. Network Configuration Page shows the network status, hostname, network name, and more.	Press the Information button  and the Resume button  at the same time.

Printer report	Description	How to print (must be in support mode)
Wi-Fi Quick Start Guide	Provides instructions to help you connect your printer to a Wi-Fi network.	Press the Information button  .

2. Search for a setting. Or click the desired function or tab, and then select a setting from the left menu.
3. Make the necessary changes.

To change printer settings from HP Smart (iOS, Android, and Windows 10)

1. Open the HP Smart app on your computer or mobile device. See [Use the HP Smart app to print, scan, and manage](#).
2. Select your printer, and then click or tap **Printer Settings**.
3. Select the desired option and make the necessary changes.

Use the HP printer software

You can use the HP printer software to change the printer settings, check estimated ink levels, order printing supplies, maintain the printer, resolve printing issues, and more.

- Each device must have the app or software installed in order to print.
- Windows 7 Service Pack 1 (SP1) is required to install HP printer software.

To install HP printer software and open the software

1. Visit 123.hp.com to download the software and install on your computer.
2. Open the software.
 - **Windows 10:** From the computer desktop, click **Start**, select **HP** from the app list, and then select the icon with the printer name.
 - **Windows 7:** From the computer desktop, click **Start**, select **All Programs**, click **HP**, click the folder for the printer, and then select the icon with the printer name.

Use the HP Smart app to print, scan, and manage

The HP Smart app can help you perform many different printer tasks, including the following:

- Set up and connect your printer.
- Print and scan documents and photos.
- Share documents through email and other applications.
- Manage printer settings, check printer status, print reports, and order supplies.

Before you begin



NOTE:

- To turn on or off the wireless capability of the printer, see [Perform common tasks on the printer control panel](#).

Ensure the following:

- The Wi-Fi network is set up and working properly.
- The printer and the computers that use the printer are on the same network (subnet).

While connecting the printer, you might be prompted to enter the Wi-Fi network name (SSID) and a Wi-Fi password.

- The Wi-Fi network name is the name of your Wi-Fi network.
- The Wi-Fi password prevents other people from connecting to your Wi-Fi network without your permission. Depending on the level of security required, your Wi-Fi network might use either a WPA passphrase or WEP key.

If you have not changed the network name or the security passkey since setting up your Wi-Fi network, you can sometimes find them on the back or side of the wireless router.

If you cannot find the network name or the security password or cannot remember this information, see the documentation provided with your computer or with the wireless router. If you still cannot find this information, contact your network administrator or the person who set up the Wi-Fi network.

Connect your printer to a Wi-Fi network using HP Smart

Install the HP Smart app on your computer or mobile device and use the app to set up or connect the printer to your Wi-Fi network.

For information about HP Smart including where to download the app, see [Use the HP Smart app to print, scan, and manage](#).

1. Make sure your computer or mobile device is connected to your Wi-Fi network. On your mobile device, turn on Bluetooth and location services.



NOTE: HP Smart uses Bluetooth for printer setup. It does not support print using Bluetooth.

2. If your printer Wi-Fi was previously turned off, make sure to turn it on. See [Perform common tasks on the printer control panel](#).

3. If the printer is no longer in Wi-Fi setup mode, restore the printer network settings. See [To restore the printer network settings from the printer control panel](#).



NOTE: For some printers or models, the purple light will start pulsing on the status light bar or the Wi-Fi light will blink when the printer is in Wi-Fi setup mode. See [Wi-Fi status, light, and icons](#).

4. Open the HP Smart app on your computer or mobile device. See [Use the HP Smart app to print, scan, and manage](#).

5. Click or tap the Plus icon  or **Add Printer**, and then choose the option to select or add a printer.

Follow the instructions to add the printer to your network.

6. When prompted, create an HP account and register the printer.

If prompted for a password during the process, enter the PIN which is available from a label in the ink access area or cartridge access area.



NOTE: When the printer is connected successfully, the Wi-Fi light stops blinking and remains lit.

Connect your printer to a Wi-Fi network with a router

This topic describes how to connect your printer to a Wi-Fi network using a router.

Connect your printer to a Wi-Fi network using HP printer software

To connect the printer to an integrated wireless WLAN 802.11 network, make sure you have the following:

- A wireless 802.11a/b/g/n/ac network that includes a wireless router or access point.



NOTE: The printer supports connections using 2.4GHz and 5GHz.

- A computer that is already connected to the Wi-Fi network that you want to use to connect your printer.
- Network name (SSID).
- WEP key or WPA Passphrase (if needed).

To connect your printer using HP printer software (Windows)

If connecting the printer wirelessly using HP software, place the printer in Wi-Fi setup mode by restoring the printer network settings. See [Restore original factory defaults and settings](#).

1. In the HP printer software (available from the **Start** menu), click **Tools**.

For information about the software, see [Use the HP printer software](#).

2. Click **Device Setup & Software**.
3. Click **Connect a new device**.
4. Select **Manual Setup**, select the wireless option, and then follow the on-screen instructions.

Connect your printer to a Wi-Fi network using Wi-Fi Protected Setup (WPS)

This Wi-Fi setup method can be used if your router has a WPS button.

If the router does not have this button, it is recommended that you connect the printer using the HP Smart app. See [Fix network connection issues](#).

1. Make sure your router and printer are not too far from each other.
2. From the printer control panel, press and hold the Wi-Fi button  for at least 3 seconds to start WPS.
3. Press the WPS button on your router.



NOTE:

- Be sure to press the WPS button on the router within 2 minutes.
 - When the printer is connected successfully, the Wi-Fi light stops blinking and remains lit.

Follow the instructions to add the printer to your network.
 6. When prompted, create an HP account and register the printer.

If prompted for a password during the process, enter the PIN which is available from a label in the ink access area or cartridge access area.

Connect your printer to an Ethernet network (Ethernet model only)

If your Ethernet network does not have an Internet connection, connect the printer wirelessly to the HP Smart app. See [Connect your printer to a Wi-Fi network using HP Smart](#).

1. Make sure your computer is connected to the router.
2. Connect your printer and router using an Ethernet cable. (Ethernet cable sold separately.)



NOTE:

- The Wi-Fi connection is automatically disabled when you connect the Ethernet cable.
 - To connect the printer wirelessly, disconnect the Ethernet cable and connect the printer to your Wi-Fi network using HP Smart. See [Connect your printer to a Wi-Fi network using HP Smart](#).

3. Open the HP Smart app on your computer. See [Use the HP Smart app to print, scan, and manage](#).

4. Click or tap the Plus icon  or **Add Printer**, and then choose the option to select or add a printer.

Connect your printer using a USB cable

1. If necessary, remove the label covering the USB port at the back of the printer.
2. Connect the printer and computer using a USB cable.
3. Open the HP Smart app on your computer. See [Use the HP Smart app to print, scan, and manage](#).
4. Click or tap the Plus icon  or **Add Printer**, and then choose the option to select or add a printer.

Follow the instructions to add the printer.

5. When prompted, create an HP account and register the printer.

If prompted for a password during the process, enter the PIN which is available from a label in the ink access area or cartridge access area.

Change the connection type

USB to a wireless connection

Windows 7

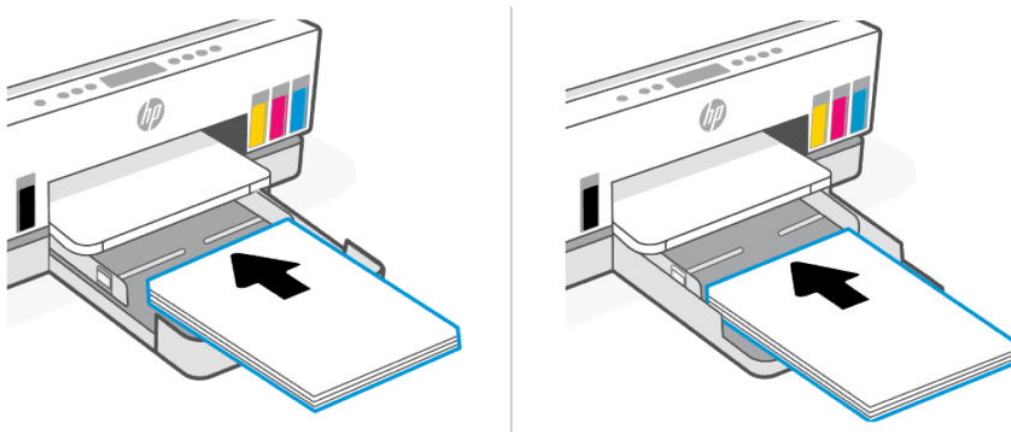

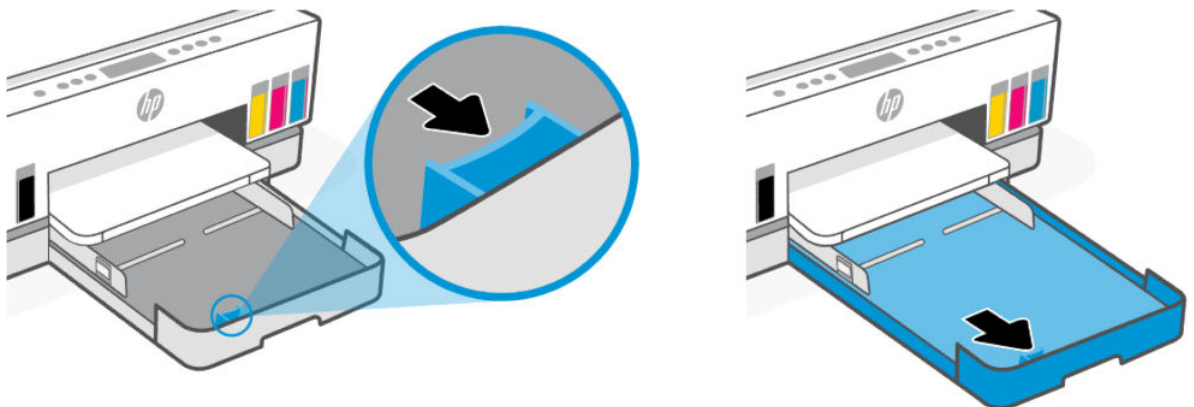


To load legal paper

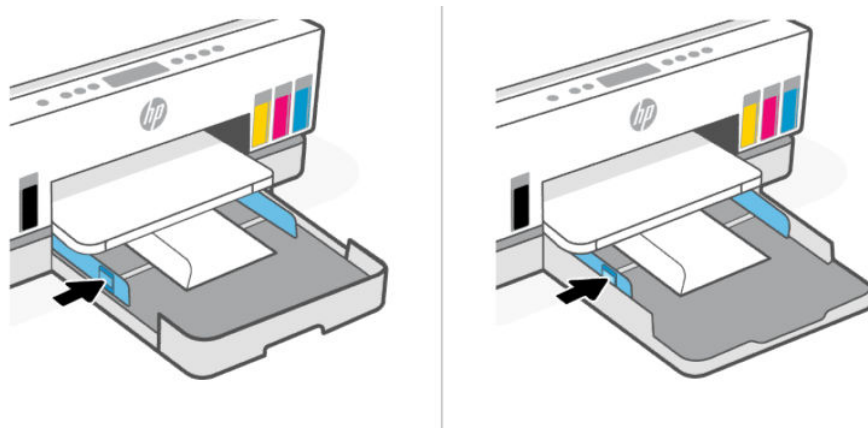

To load cards and photo paper

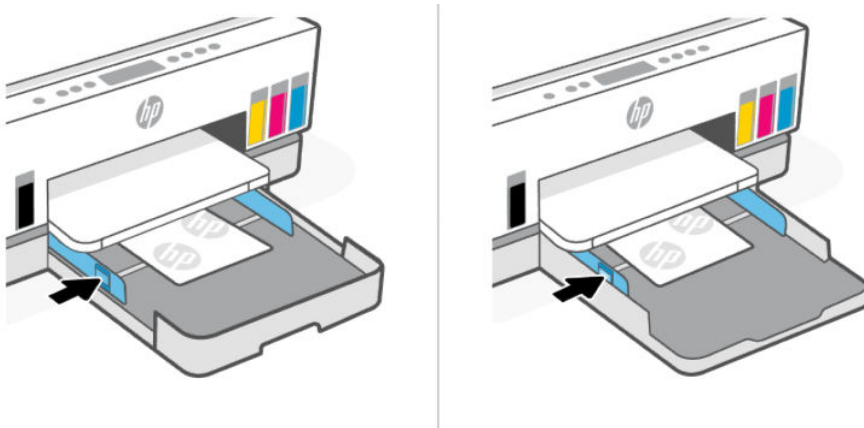

5. Close the input tray.

Load original

To load an original on the scanner glass

1. Lift the scanner lid.



2. Load the original print-side down on the scanner glass (aligned to the indicated corner).

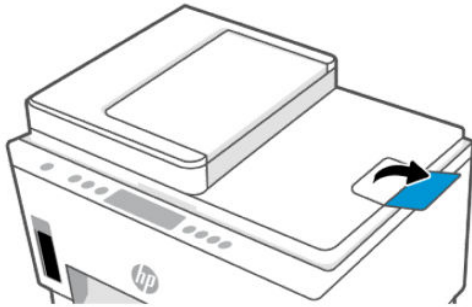

5. Click **Apply**.

Paper basics

The printer is designed to work well with most types of office paper. It is best to test a variety of print paper types before buying large quantities.

Use HP paper for optimum print quality. Visit the HP website at www.hp.com for more information about HP paper.



HP recommends plain papers with the ColorLok logo for printing everyday documents. All papers with the ColorLok logo are independently tested to meet high standards of reliability and print quality, and produce documents with crisp, vivid color, bolder blacks, and that dry faster than ordinary plain papers. Look for papers with the ColorLok logo in a variety of weights and sizes from major paper manufacturers.

Recommended papers for printing

If you want the best print quality, HP recommends using HP papers that are specifically designed for the type of project you are printing. Depending on your country/region, some of these papers might not be available.

Photo printing

- **HP Advanced Photo Paper**

4 Print

This section describes how to print from different devices.

This printer is designed to work with the HP Smart app, a software application that makes it easy to print, scan, and manage your printer from a smartphone, laptop, desktop computer, or other devices.

You can print and manage the printer from all of your devices by installing the app on each device. For more information about the app, see [Use the HP Smart app to print, scan, and manage](#).

Print from a Windows computer

1. Make sure you have installed the HP Smart. See [Use the HP Smart app to print, scan, and manage](#).
2. Open the document you wish to print.
3. From the **File** menu in your software program, select the **Print** option.
4. Click the button that opens the **Properties** dialog box.

Depending on your software application, this button might be called **Properties**, **Options**, **Setup**, or **Preferences**.

5. Make sure your printer is selected.
6. Change any print settings, and click **OK**.
7. Click **Print** or the **OK** button to print.

Print from a Mac computer

1. Make sure you have installed the HP Smart app. See [Use the HP Smart app to print, scan, and manage](#).
2. From the computer, open **System Preference**, and select **Printers and Scanners**.
3. Click the Add button/icon + , select the printer from the printer list, and then click **Add**.
4. Once connected, open the document you wish to print and use the **Print** command.
5. Make sure the desired printer is selected.
6. Change any print settings.
7. Click **Print** to print the document.

Print with mobile devices

You can use the HP Smart app to print documents and photos from your mobile device, social media account, or cloud storage.

You can also print directly from your mobile devices using AirPrint (iOS) or HP Print Service Plugin (Android):

- **iOS:** Devices running iOS 4.2 or later have AirPrint pre-installed.

To turn Wi-Fi Direct on or off

When Wi-Fi Direct is turned on, the Wi-Fi Direct icon  should appear on the printer display. If the icon is off, follow these instructions.

1. From the printer control panel, press and hold the Information button  for 5 seconds until the control panel buttons light up.
2. Press and hold the Wi-Fi button  and the Resume button  at the same time for 3 seconds.



NOTE: When you turn on Wi-Fi Direct the first time, the printer automatically prints a Wi-Fi Direct guide. The guide provides instructions about how to use Wi-Fi Direct. See [Print reports from the printer control panel](#).

To find the Wi-Fi Direct name or password

From the printer control panel, press the Information button  to print the printer information page.



NOTE: For other network details, print the network configuration page. See [Print reports from the printer control panel](#).

To change the Wi-Fi Direct connection security settings for the printer using the embedded web server (EWS)

1. Open EWS. See [To access and use EWS](#).
2. Click the **Network** tab.
3. From the left menu, click **Wi-Fi Direct**, and then click the **Edit Settings** button.
4. Make the necessary changes.
5. Click **Apply**.

5 Copy, Scan, and Mobile Fax

This section describes the copy, scan, and use mobile fax features.

Copy from the printer

 **NOTE:** All documents are copied in normal quality print mode. You cannot change the print mode quality when copying.

1. Load paper in the input tray.
See [Load paper](#).
2. Place the original print-side up in the document feeder or print-side down on the scanner glass (aligned to the corner with an icon).
See [Load original](#).
3. From the printer control panel, press the Black Copy button  or the Color Copy button  to start copying.

To increase the number of copies, press and hold the button or press it multiple times.

Copying starts 2 seconds after the last button press.

Copy an identification (ID) card (some printer models)

The ID Copy feature allows you to place a card or small-size document anywhere on the scanner glass to copy both sides onto the same page.

1. Load paper in the input tray.
See [Load paper](#).
2. Place the card anywhere on the scanner glass, away from the edges or corners of the glass.
3. Close the scanner lid.



4. Press the ID Copy button  to enter the ID Copy mode.

The Color Copy button  and the Black Copy button  will blink or light up.

5. Press either copy button to copy one side of the card.

To increase the number of copies, press and hold the button or press it multiple times.

6. When the Open Lid light  blinks or lights up, open the scanner lid, flip the card on the scanner glass, and then close the scanner lid.



7. Press the copy button that is blinking or lit to copy the other side.
8. Wait for the page to print.

Scan using the HP Smart app (iOS, Android, Windows 10, and macOS)

You can use the HP Smart app to scan documents or photos from the printer's scanner, and you can also scan using your device camera. HP Smart includes editing tools that allow you to adjust the scanned image before saving or sharing. You can print, save your scans locally or in cloud storage, and share them via email, SMS, Facebook, Instagram, etc. To scan with HP Smart, follow the instructions provided in the appropriate URLs below, depending on the type of device you are using.

Scan from a computer

Before scanning from a computer, make sure you have already installed the HP recommended printer software. The printer and computer must be connected and turned on.

To scan a document or photo to a file (Windows)

1. Place the original print-side up in the document feeder or print-side down on the scanner glass (aligned to the corner with an icon).
2. In the HP printer software (available from the **Start** menu), click **Scan**, and then click **Scan a Document or Photo**.
3. Select the type of scan you want, and then click **Scan**.

Choose the file format to save the document (or photo).



NOTE:

- Click the **More** link at the top right corner of the Scan dialog to review and modify settings for any scan. See [Change scan settings \(Windows\)](#).
- If **Show Viewer After Scan** is selected, you can make adjustments to the scanned image in the preview screen.

To scan a document or photo to email (Windows)

1. Place the original print-side up in the document feeder or print-side down on the scanner glass (aligned to the corner with an icon).
2. In the HP printer software, available from the **Start** menu, click **Scan**, and then click **Scan a Document or Photo**.
3. Select the type of scan you want, and then click **Scan**.



NOTE:

- Click the **More** link at the top right corner of the Scan dialog to review and modify settings for any scan. See [Change scan settings \(Windows\)](#).
- If **Show Viewer After Scan** is selected, you can make adjustments to the scanned image in the preview screen.

Change scan settings (Windows)

You can modify any of the scan settings either for a singular use or save the changes to use permanently. These settings include options such as page size and orientation, scan resolution, contrast, and the folder location for saved scans.

1. Place the original print-side up in the document feeder or print-side down on the scanner glass (aligned to the corner with an icon).
2. In the HP printer software, available from the **Start** menu, click **Scan**, and then click **Scan a Document or Photo**.
3. Click the **More** link in the top right corner of the HP Scan dialog.

The detailed settings pane appears on the right. The left column summarizes the current settings for each section. The right column allows you to change the settings in the highlighted section.

4. Click each section at the left of the detailed settings pane to review the settings in that section.

You can review and change most settings using drop-down menus.

Some settings allow greater flexibility by displaying a new pane. These are indicated by a + (plus sign) at the right of the setting. You must either click **OK** to accept or click **Cancel** to cancel any changes on this pane to return to the detailed settings pane.

5. When you have finished changing settings, do one of the following:
 - Click **Scan**. You are prompted to save or reject the changes to the shortcut after the scan is finished.
 - Click the save icon to the right of the shortcut, and then click **Scan**.

Create a new scan shortcut (Windows)

You can create your own scan shortcut to make scanning easier. For example, you might want to regularly scan and save photos in PNG format, rather than JPEG.

1. Place the original print-side up in the document feeder or print-side down on the scanner glass (aligned to the corner with an icon).
2. In the HP printer software, available from the **Start** menu, click **Scan**, and then click **Scan a Document or Photo**.
3. Click **Create New Scan Shortcut**.
4. Enter a descriptive name, choose an existing shortcut on which to base your new shortcut, and then click **Create**.
5. Change the settings for your new shortcut to meet your needs, and then click the save icon to the right of the shortcut.



NOTE: Click the **More** link at the top right corner of the Scan dialog to review and modify settings for any scan.

Scan using Webscan

Webscan is a feature of the EWS that lets you scan photos and documents from your printer to your device using a web browser.



NOTE: For your security, some settings in the EWS are password-protected. Enter the password if prompted. This is the password you have set in the EWS or the default PIN on a label in the ink access area.

To enable Webscan

1. Open EWS. For more information, see [To access and use EWS](#).
2. Click the **Settings** tab.
3. From the left menu, click **Security**, and then select **Administrator Settings**.
4. Select the option to enable Webscan.
5. Click **Apply**.

To scan using Webscan

Scanning using Webscan offers basic scan options. For additional scan options or functionality, scan from the HP printer software.

1. Place the original print-side up in the document feeder or print-side down on the scanner glass (aligned to the corner with an icon). See [Load original](#).
2. Open EWS. For more information, see [To access and use EWS](#).
3. Click the **Scan** tab.
4. From the left menu, click **Webscan**.
5. Select the desired options, and then click **Start Scan**.

Tips for successful scanning and copying

Use the following tips to copy and scan successfully:

- Keep the glass and the back of the lid clean. The scanner interprets anything it detects on the glass as part of the image.
- Load the original print-side down on the scanner glass (aligned to the corner with an icon).
- To make a large copy of a small original, scan the original into the computer, resize the image in the scanning software, and then print a copy of the enlarged image.
- To avoid incorrect or missing scanned text, make sure the brightness is set appropriately in the software.
- Make sure to select the correct source (for example, scanner glass) for scanning when using HP software.

Mobile Fax

Use the HP Smart app to quickly scan and fax multiple pages at once from your mobile device or computer.

Use Mobile Fax in the HP Smart app

1. Make sure your mobile device or computer are connected to a network. Launch the HP Smart app and sign into or create your HP account.

2. Select the Mobile Fax tile.

If you do not see the **Mobile Fax** tile, enable it as follows:

- On a mobile device: Tap **Personalize Tiles**, tap the **Mobile Fax** toggle to enable the tile, and then go back to the Home screen.
- On a Windows 10 device: Click the **Settings**, select **Personalize Tiles**, and click the **Mobile Fax** toggle to enable the tile. Then, go back to the Home screen.
- On a Mac device: From the menu bar, select **HP Smart >Personalize Tiles**. Set the Mobile Fax option to **On**.



NOTE: Mobile Fax is available in specific countries/regions. If you do not see a Mobile Fax option in the Personalize Menu, Mobile Fax might not be available in your country/region.

3. Fill out the necessary mobile fax information.

4. To add a cover page, tap the **Add a cover page** toggle, and then type a subject and message.

5. Scan the item you want to fax using your printer or mobile device camera, or attach a supported file type. Send the fax when ready.

Your fax will be securely delivered and you can track the status in the HP Smart app.

6 Configure your printer

This section describes how to configure your printer.

Configure the printer using the embedded web server (EWS)

Use the embedded web server (EWS) to manage printing functions from your computer.

- View printer status information
- Check the information and status of the printing supplies
- Receive notification of printer and supplies events
- View and change the network and the printer settings

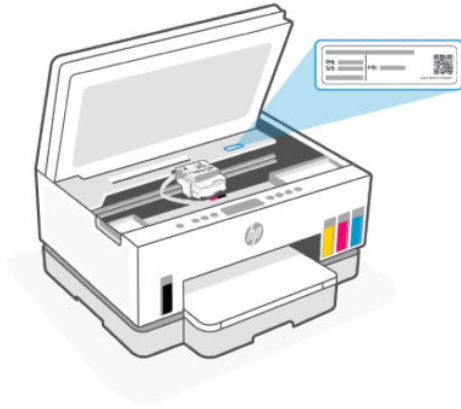
To access and use EWS

You can open EWS using one of the following:

- HP Smart app
- HP printer software
- Web browser using IP address
- Web browser using Wi-Fi Direct connection

Things to note when accessing EWS

- If the web browser displays a message indicating that the website is unsafe, select the option to continue. Accessing the website will not harm your device.
- The default username is “admin”.
- For your security, some settings in the printer home page or EWS are password-protected.
 - When accessing the EWS for the first time, enter the PIN if prompted. This personal identification number (PIN) is available from a label in the printer.
 - Open the ink access door or cartridge access door to locate the label.
 - Once you have access to EWS, you can change the password from EWS.



- Depending on how the printer is connected, some features in EWS might not be available.
- EWS is not accessible beyond the network firewall.

To open EWS using HP Smart (iOS, Android, and Windows 10)

1. Open the HP Smart app on your computer or mobile device. See [Use the HP Smart app to print, scan, and manage](#).
2. From HP Smart, select your printer, and then click or tap **Advanced Settings**.

To open EWS using an IP address (Wi-Fi or Ethernet connection)

1. Find out the IP address. Press the Information button  on the printer to print an information page.
2. Open a web browser, type the IP address or hostname in the address bar, and then click or tap **Enter**.

To open EWS using an IP address (Wi-Fi Direct connection)

1. Make sure your device and the printer are connected using Wi-Fi Direct. See [Print while connected to same Wi-Fi network](#).
2. Open a web browser, type the following IP address or hostname of the printer in the address bar, and then click or tap **Enter**.

IP Address: 192.168.223.1

To open EWS using HP Printer software (Windows 7)

1. From the computer desktop, click **Start**, select **All Programs**, click **HP**, click the folder for the printer, select the icon with the printer's name, and then open **HP Printer Assistant**.



NOTE: Windows 7 Service Pack 1 (SP1) is required to install HP printer software.

2. In the **HP Printer Assistant**, select **Print** tab.
3. Select **Printer Home Page (EWS)**.

Configure IP network settings

Use the following sections to configure the printer network settings.

If prompted for a password, enter the PIN which is available from a label in the cartridge access area. See [Things to note when accessing EWS](#).

View or change network settings

Use the embedded web server (EWS) to view or change IP configuration settings.

1. Open EWS. See [To access and use EWS](#).
2. Click the **Network** tab to obtain network information. Change settings as needed.

Rename the printer on a network

To rename the printer on a network so that it can be uniquely identified, use the embedded web server (EWS).

1. Open EWS. See [To access and use EWS](#).
2. Click the **Network** tab.
3. From the left menu, click **General**.
4. Click **Network Identification**.
5. Make the necessary changes, and then click **Apply**.

Manually configure IPv4 TCP/IP parameters

Use the embedded web server (EWS) to manually set an IPv4 address, subnet mask, and default gateway.

1. Open EWS. See [To access and use EWS](#).
2. Click the **Network** tab.
3. From the left menu, click **Wired**.
4. Click **IPv4 Configuration**.
5. Make the necessary changes, and then **Apply**.

Assign or change the system password using the embedded web server (EWS)

Assign an administrator password for access to the printer and EWS so that unauthorized users cannot change the printer settings.

1. Open EWS. See [To access and use EWS](#).
2. Click the **Settings** tab.
3. From the left menu, click **Security**.
4. Click **Password Settings**.
5. Make the necessary changes, and then click **Apply**.



NOTE: Make note of the password and store it in a safe place.

Update the printer

This topic describes how to update the printer firmware.

HP periodically releases firmware updates to enhance product functionality and fix issues. By default, if the printer is connected to the Internet, the printer automatically checks for updates at regular intervals.

To update the printer or change the settings from the embedded web server (EWS)

1. Open EWS. See [To access and use EWS](#).
2. Click the **Tools** tab.
3. From the left menu, click **Printer Updates**, and then select **Firmware Updates**.
4. Select the desired options, and then click **Apply**.

Use Web Services

This topic describes how to use Web services.



NOTE: For your security, some settings in the embedded web server (EWS) are password-protected. Enter the password if prompted. This is the password you have set in the EWS or the default PIN on a label in the ink access area.

To set up Web Services using the embedded web server (EWS)

1. Open EWS. See [To access and use EWS](#).
2. Click the **Web Services** tab.
3. From the left menu, click **Web Services Settings**.
4. Click **Setup**, select the relevant option or button to continue, and follow the on-screen instructions to accept the terms of use.



NOTE: If prompted for proxy settings and if your network uses proxy settings, follow the on-screen instructions to set up a proxy server. If you do not have the proxy details, contact your network administrator or the person who set up the network.

5. When the printer is connected to the server, the printer prints an information page. Follow the instructions on the information page to finish the setup.

To remove Web Services using the embedded web server (EWS)

1. Open EWS. See [To access and use EWS](#).
2. Click the **Web Services** tab.
3. From the left menu, click **Web Services Settings**, click **Remove Web Services**, and then follow the on-screen instructions.

7 Manage ink and printheads

This section describes how to manage ink and printheads.

Check the ink levels

You can check the ink levels from the ink tanks on the printer. You can also check the HP printer software or printer control panel to determine when the tanks need to be refilled.

If you are using the HP Smart app, the estimated ink levels of the selected printer is displayed on the Home screen.

To check the estimated ink levels from the printer software (Windows)

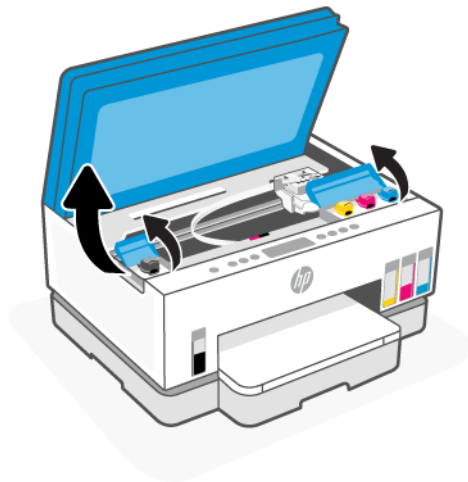
1. In the HP printer software (available from the **Start** menu), click **Estimated Levels** at the top of the window.
2. In the Toolbox, click the **Estimated Levels** tab.

Refill ink tanks

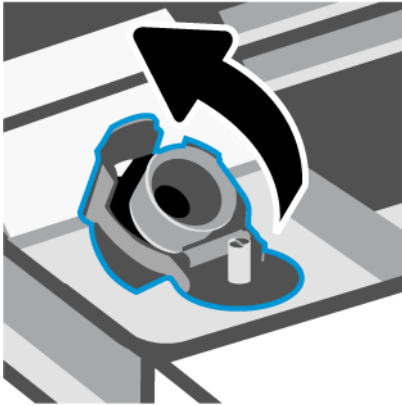
 **NOTE:** Product service or repairs required as a result of filling the ink tanks improperly and/or using non-HP ink will not be covered under warranty.

To refill the ink tanks

1. Open the ink access door and tank covers.



2. Open the cap of the ink tank you plan to refill.

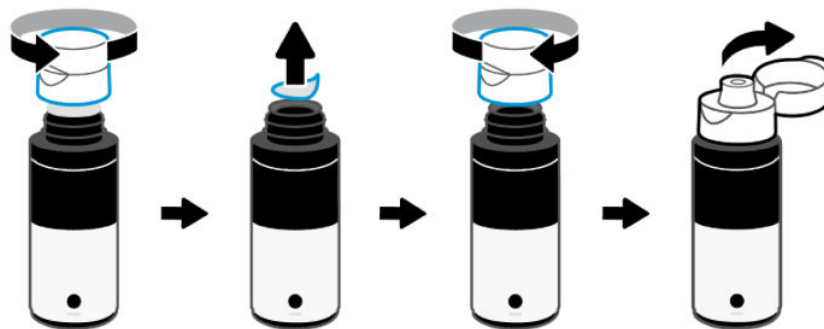


3. Depending on the type of ink bottles you have, do one of following:

- **Screw-cap bottles:** Twist open the cap on the ink bottle.



- **Flip-cap bottles:** Twist open the cap on the ink bottle, remove the seal from the bottle, screw back the cap and tighten it. Then, flip open the top of the cap.



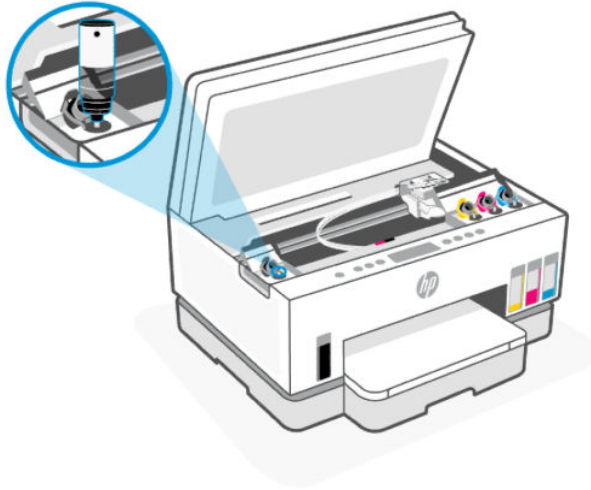
4. Match the color of the ink bottle with the color of the ink tank.

Place the bottle upside down on the tank, make sure the tip of the bottle fits properly over the tank nozzle.



NOTE:

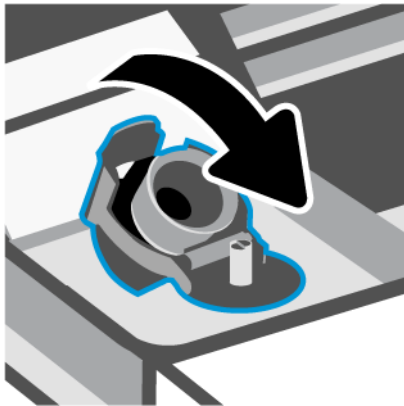
- For screw-cap bottles, the tip of the bottle should click into place when pressed down gently over the tank nozzle.
 - Do not squeeze the ink bottles when filling ink. The ink bottles you have might vary.
 - If there is leftover ink in the bottle, store the bottle in an upright position in a cool and dry location.
-



5. Let the ink drain into the tank until the tank is full.

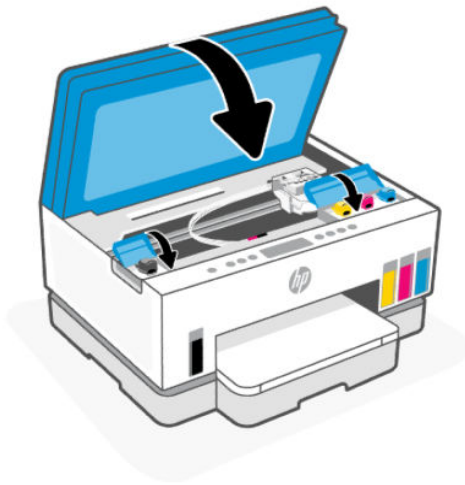
If the ink does not drain immediately, remove the bottle and properly reinsert it on the tank.

6. Close the tank cap securely.



7. Repeat steps 2 to 6 to refill other ink tanks.

8. Close the tank covers and ink access door.



Precautions for working with ink bottles

Use the following tips to work with ink bottles:

- Keep the ink bottles beyond the reach of children.
- Open the ink bottles only when you plan to fill the ink tanks.
- Do not tilt, shake, or squeeze the ink bottle when it is open to prevent ink leaks.
- Store the ink bottles in a cool, dark place.
- Do not drink or place in mouth.

Order ink supplies

Before ordering ink bottles, visually check the labels on the ink bottles to locate the ink bottle numbers. You can also find this information on a label in the ink access area.

To order original HP supplies for the printer, go to www.hp.com/buy/supplies. If prompted, choose your country/region, and then follow the prompts to find the right ink bottles for your printer.



NOTE: Ordering ink bottles online is not supported in all countries/regions. If it is not available in your country/region, you may still view supplies information and print a list for reference when shopping at a local HP reseller.

Print with black ink only (Windows)

1. From your software, select **Print**.
2. Make sure your printer is selected.

3. Click the button that opens the **Properties** dialog box.

Depending on your software application, this button might be called **Properties**, **Options**, **Printer Setup**, **Printer Properties**, **Printer**, or **Preferences**.

4. Select the appropriate options.

- **Windows 10**

- Click **Paper/Quality** tab.
- Under **Print in Grayscale**, select **Black Ink Only** from the list, and then click **OK**.

- **Windows 7**

- On the **Layout** or **Paper/Quality** tab, click the **Advanced** button to open the **Advanced Options** dialog box.
- From the **Print in Grayscale** drop-down list, select **Black Ink Only**, and then click **OK**.

Improve print quality

You can print a diagnostics page to determine if cleaning or aligning the printheads is recommended to improve print quality.

To print a print quality diagnostics page, see [Print reports from the printer control panel](#).

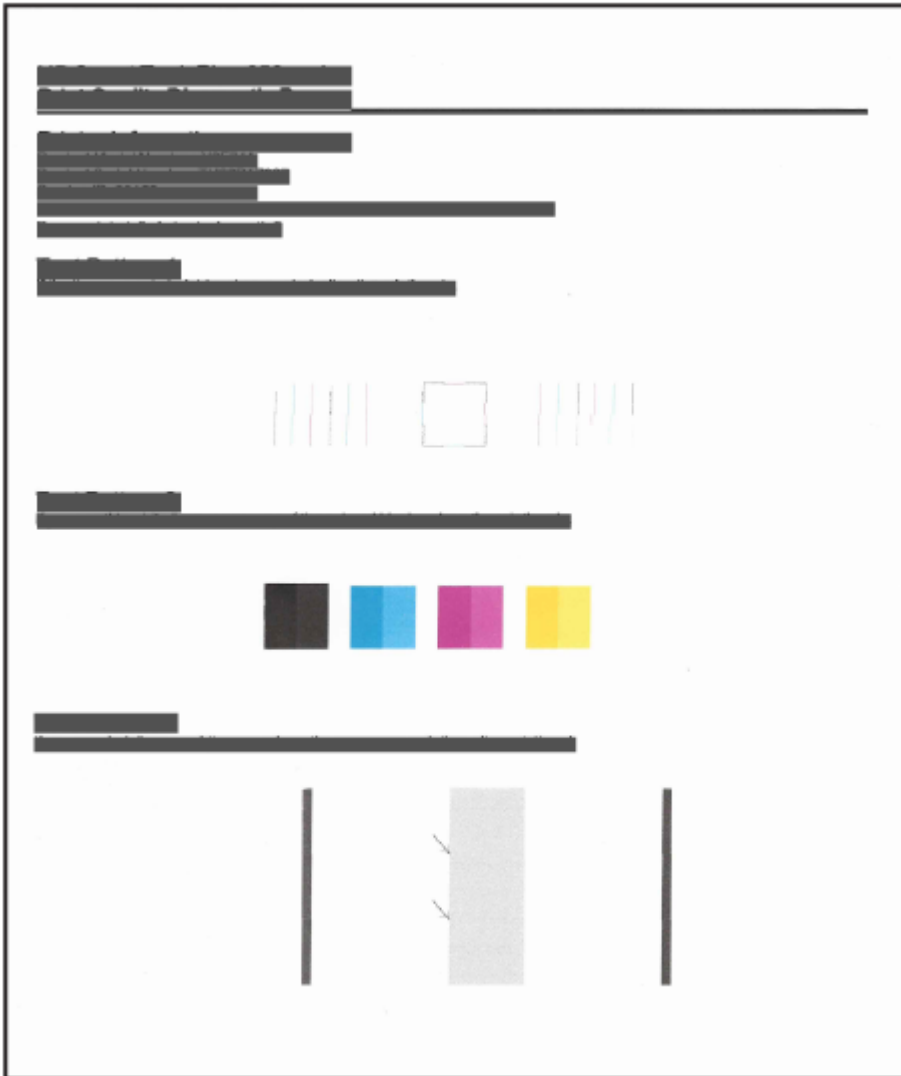
You can also use the HP Smart app to improve the print quality. For information about this app, see [Use the HP Smart app to print, scan, and manage](#).

To print a print quality diagnostics page (Windows)

1. Load Letter or A4 unused plain white paper into the input tray.
2. In the HP printer software (available from the **Start** menu), click **Print & Scan** at the top of the window.
3. In the **Print** section, click **Maintain Your Printer** to access the Toolbox.
4. In the Toolbox, click the **Device Services** tab, and then click the option to print the page.

Understand the print quality diagnostics page

1. Review the black, cyan, magenta, and yellow boxes along with the other content on the diagnostics page.



2. If the diagnostic page shows streaks or missing portions of the color and black boxes, then automatically clean the printheads.
See [Align and clean printheads](#).
3. If straight lines appear jagged on printouts, or the diagnostic page indicates to align the printheads, then automatically align the printheads.
See [Align and clean printheads](#).
4. If print quality problems persist after cleaning and aligning printheads, contact HP support.

Align and clean printheads

The printer has a feature to automatically align or clean the printheads.

You can check the print quality diagnostics page to determine if aligning or cleaning is recommended. See [Understand the print quality diagnostics page](#).

- **Align printheads:** Aligning the printheads can improve print quality. If you notice misaligned colors or lines in your printouts or on the print quality diagnostics page, you should perform an alignment.
- **Clean printheads:** If your prints are streaked or have incorrect or missing colors, the printheads might need to be cleaned.



NOTE:

- The cleaning process prints one page to attempt to clean the printheads.
 - Clean the printheads only when necessary. Unnecessary cleaning wastes ink and shortens the life of the printheads.
-

To align or clean the printheads from the embedded web server (EWS)

1. Open EWS. See [To access and use EWS](#).
2. Click the **Tools** tab.
3. From the left menu, click **Utilities**, and select **Print Quality Toolbox**.
4. Click the button next to the option to align or clean printheads.

To align or clean the printheads (Windows)

1. Load Letter or A4 unused plain white paper into the input tray.
2. In the HP printer software (available from the **Start** menu), click **Print & Scan** at the top of the window.
3. In the **Print** section, click **Maintain Your Printer** to access the Toolbox.
4. In the Toolbox, click the **Device Services** tab, click the desired option, and then follow the on-screen instructions.

Clean printer

You can run a cleaning routine from the printer software to prevent back of page smearing.

To clean the printer from the printer software (Windows)

1. Load Letter or A4 unused plain white paper into the input tray.
2. In the HP printer software (available from the **Start** menu), click **Print & Scan** at the top of the window.
3. In the **Print** section, click **Maintain Your Printer** to access the Toolbox.
4. In the Toolbox, click the **Device Services** tab, click the desired option, and then follow the on-screen instructions.

Tips for working with ink and printheads

Printhead tips

Use the following tips to work with printheads:

- Use original HP printheads.
- Handle printheads with care. Do not drop the printheads, and do not touch the electric contacts or print nozzles on any surface.
- To protect the printheads from drying out, always turn the printer off using the Power button, and wait until the Power button light goes out.
- Do not open or untape printheads until you are ready to install them, as this can lead to print quality issues. Leaving tape on the printheads reduces ink evaporation.
- Install both the black and color printheads correctly. See [To verify the printheads are installed properly](#).
- After you have set up the printer, do not open the printhead cover unless instructed to do so.
- You can align the printheads to improve the print quality. See [Improve print quality](#) for more information.
- If you remove a printhead from the printer for any reason, try to replace it again as soon as possible. If left unprotected outside the printer, the printhead may begin to dry out.

Ink tips

Use the following tips to work with ink:

- Make sure the ink tanks are not low on ink before printing. See [Check the ink levels](#).
- Refill the ink tanks when they are low on ink. Printing with the ink tanks low on ink may cause damage to your printer.
- Do not tilt the printer.



NOTE: Original HP printheads and ink are designed and tested with HP printers and papers to help you easily produce great results, time after time.

HP cannot guarantee the quality or reliability of non-HP supplies. Product service or repairs required as a result of using a non-HP supply will not be covered under warranty.

Move printer

To prevent damage to the printer or ink leakage, follow these instructions.

If you are moving the printer within your home or office, keep the printhead cover closed, and keep the printer horizontal.

To move the printer to a different location outside of your home or office, see the instructions provided in the box for moving printer, or visit hp.com/support.

Jams and paper-feed issues

This topic helps you troubleshoot jams and paper-feed issues.

Clear a paper or print carriage jam

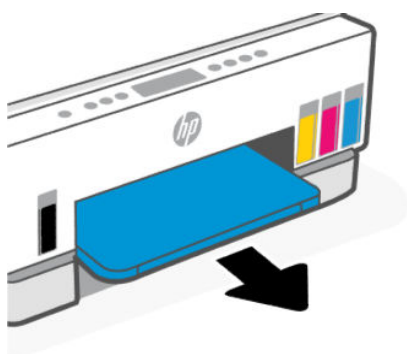
Paper jams can occur in several locations. For print carriage jams, remove any objects, including paper, that are blocking the print carriage in the ink access area.



NOTE: Do not use any tools or other devices to remove jammed objects. Always use caution when removing jammed objects from inside the printer.

To clear paper jams from the tray

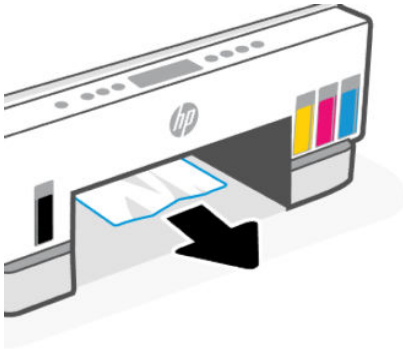
1. Remove the input tray.
2. Remove the output tray.



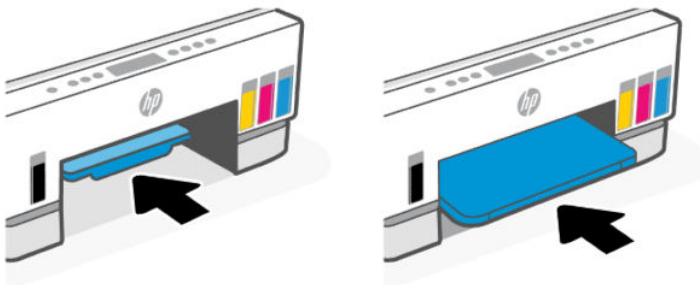
3. Remove the duplexer plate. Do this by carefully reaching inside the gap where the trays were and pulling out the plate.

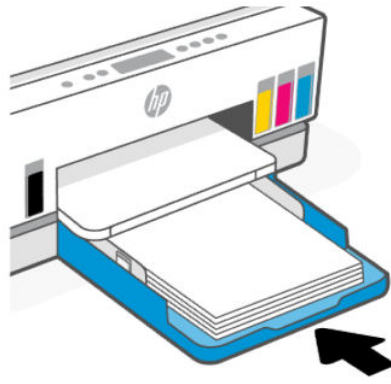
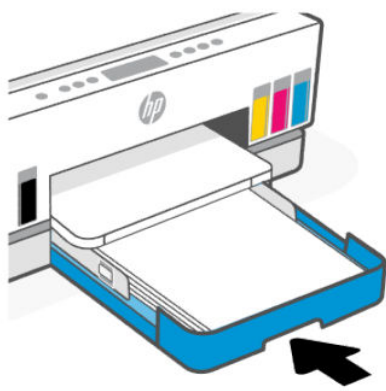


4. Remove any jammed paper.



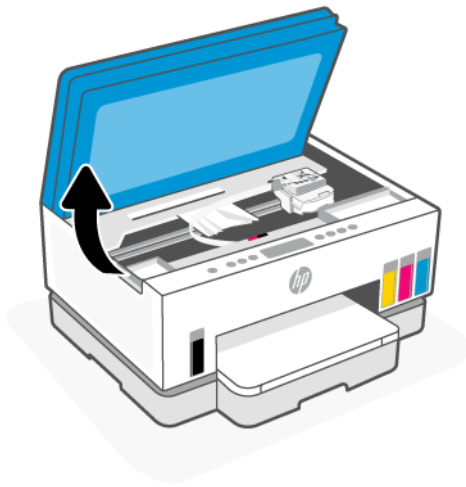
5. Reinsert the duplexer plate, the output tray, and then the input tray.



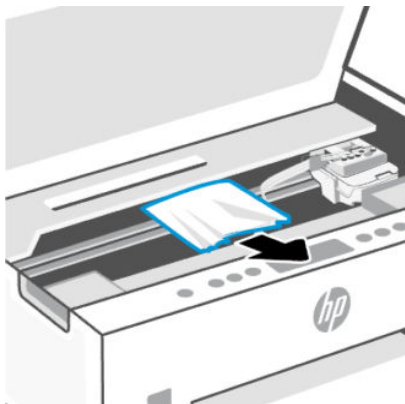


To clear paper jams from the inside of the printer

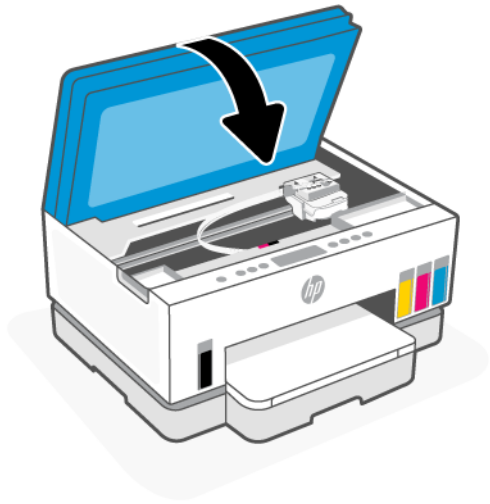
1. Lift the ink access door.



2. Remove any jammed paper.

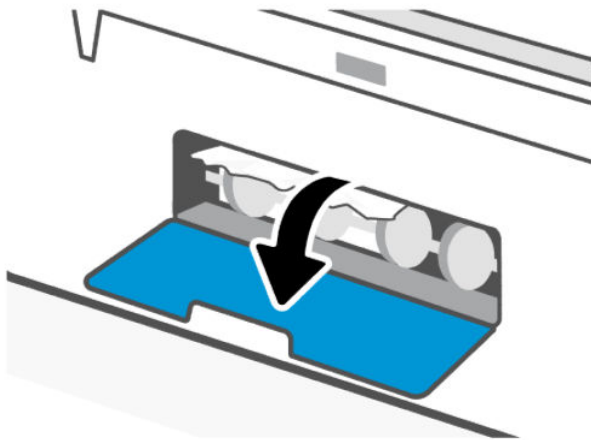


3. Close the ink access door.

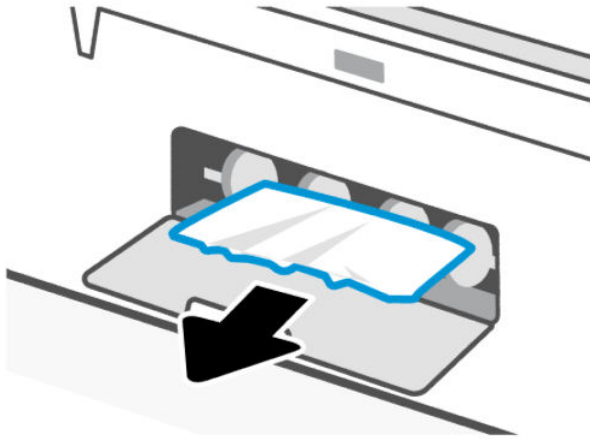


To clear paper jams from the rear of the printer

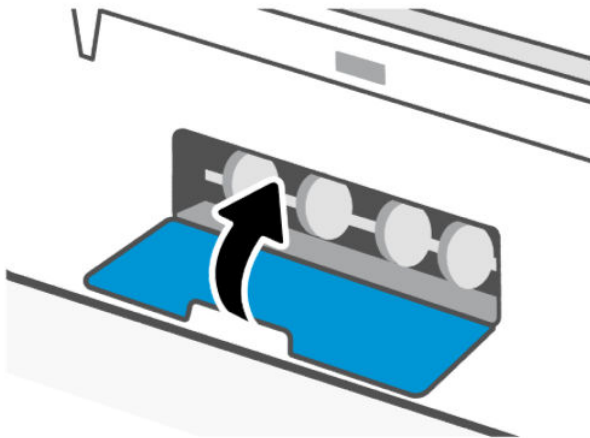
1. Open the door at the rear of the printer.

3. Close the rear door.

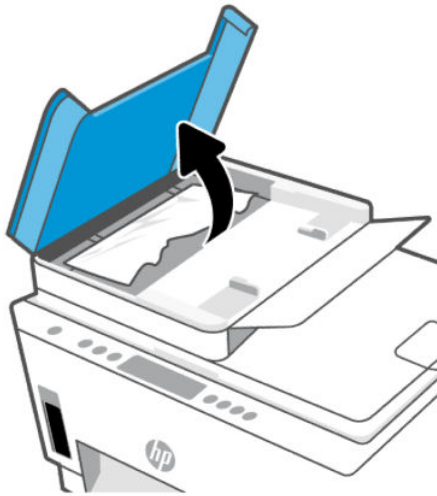


To clear paper jams from the document feeder (some printer models)

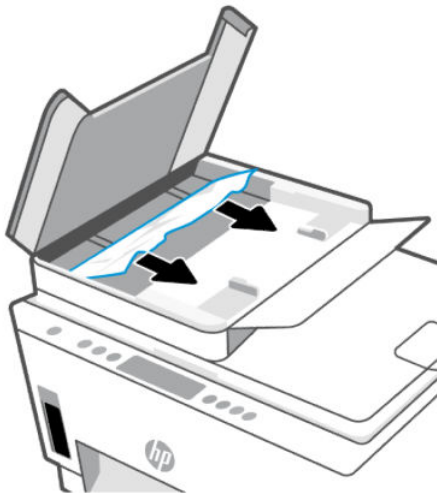


NOTE: If paper jams keep occurring when using the document feeder, and other means to avoid document feeder jams do not help, try cleaning the document feeder glass area using a dry, lint-free cloth. See [Clean the document feeder glass area \(some printer models\)](#).

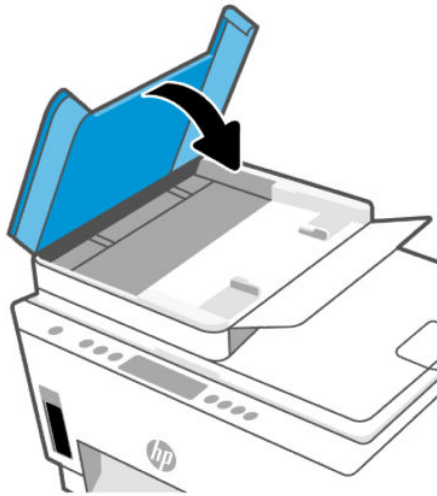
1. Open the document feeder cover.



2. Remove any jammed paper.



3. Close the document feeder cover.



Learn how to avoid paper jams

To avoid paper jams, follow these guidelines.

- Do not overfill the input tray, but make sure that you have at least 5 pages loaded, for best results.
- Keep your printer free of dust and debris by removing paper and closing the input tray when not in use.
- Remove printed papers from the output tray frequently.
- Ensure that paper loaded in the input tray lays flat, and the edges are not bent or torn.
- Do not combine different paper types and paper sizes in the input tray; the entire stack of paper in the input tray must be the same size and type.

Use HP paper for optimum performance. See [Paper basics](#) for more information about HP paper.

- Adjust the paper-width guides in the input tray to fit snugly against all paper. Make sure the paper-width guides do not bend the paper in the input tray.
- Do not force paper too far down in the input tray.
- Do not add paper while the printer is printing. Wait for the printer to prompt before loading paper.

Solve paper-feed problems

What kind of problem are you having?

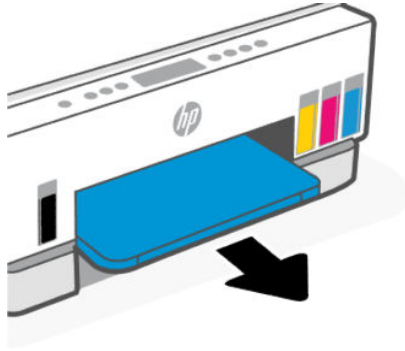
- **Paper is not picked up from the input tray**
 - Make sure paper is loaded in the input tray. See [Load paper](#).
 - Adjust the paper-width guides in the input tray to fit snugly against all paper. Make sure the paper-width guides do not bend the paper in the input tray.
 - Make sure paper in the input tray is not curled. Uncurl paper by bending it in the opposite direction of the curl.

- Prevent curled or wrinkled paper by storing all unused paper flat in a resealable bag.
- After printing is finished, remove unused photo paper from the input tray. Store the photo paper so it does not start to curl, which could reduce the quality of your printout.
- Clean the paper rollers.
- **Pages are skewing**
 - Make sure the paper loaded in the input tray is aligned to the paper-width guides. If needed, pull out the input tray from the printer and reload the paper correctly, making sure that the paper guides are aligned correctly.
 - Load paper into the printer only when it is not printing.
 - Make sure the rear access door is securely shut.
- **Multiple pages are being picked up**
 - Adjust the paper-width guides in the input tray to fit snugly against all paper. Make sure the paper-width guides do not bend the paper in the input tray.
 - Make sure the input tray is not overloaded with paper.
 - Make sure the pieces of the loaded paper are not sticking together.
 - Use HP paper for optimum performance and efficiency.
 - Clean the paper rollers.

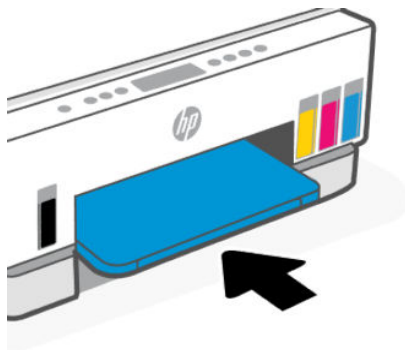
To clean the paper rollers manually

1. Gather the following materials:
 - A long, lint-free cotton swab
 - Distilled, filtered, or bottled water (tap water might damage the printer)
2. Press the Power button  to turn off the printer.
3. Disconnect the power cord from the rear of the printer.
4. Disconnect any other cable from the printer.
5. Remove the input tray.

6. Remove the output tray.



7. Look inside the gap where the trays were and find the gray paper pick rollers. You might need a flashlight to illuminate the area.
8. Dampen a long cotton swab with bottled or distilled water, and then squeeze any excess water from the cloth.
9. Press the swab against the rollers, and then rotate them away from you with your fingers. Apply a moderate amount of pressure to remove dust or dirt buildup.
10. Allow the rollers to dry for 10 or 15 minutes.
11. Reinsert the output tray and the input tray.



12. Reconnect the power cord to the rear of the printer.
13. Reconnect any other cable to the printer if necessary.
14. Press the Power button to turn on the printer.

Printhead problem

This topic helps you troubleshoot printhead problems.

1. Verify that the indicated printhead is correctly installed.
2. Clean the printhead contacts.

3. Contact HP support for assistance. Go to hp.com/support.

To verify the printheads are installed properly



NOTE:

- The instructions here are only applicable in this section. After you have set up the printer, do not open the printhead cover unless instructed to do so.
- Handle printheads with care. Do not drop the printheads, and do not touch the electric contacts or print nozzles on any surface.

1. Make sure the printer is turned on.
2. Lift the ink access door. Wait for the print carriage to move to the center and stop.



NOTE: After you have set up the printer, do not open the printhead cover unless instructed to do so.

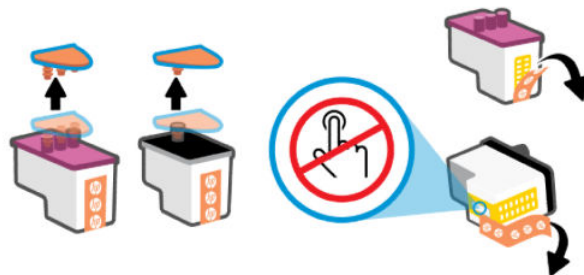
3. Remove and reinsert the printhead.
 - a. Press the blue button to open the printhead cover.
 - b. Remove the printhead from the carriage.



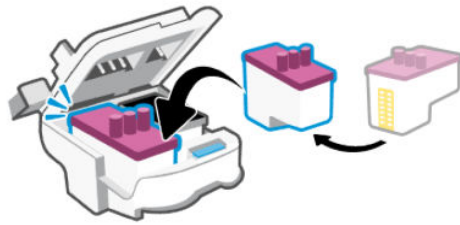
- c. If you find any orange cap or tape on the printhead, remove it.



CAUTION: Do not touch the electric contacts or print nozzles.

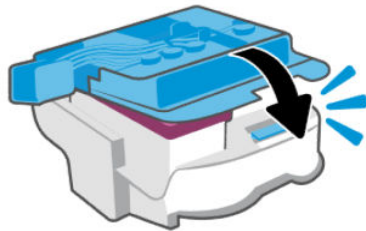


- d. Insert the printhead into the slot until it clicks into place.



- e. Close the printhead cover.

Make sure it is properly closed to avoid problems such as carriage jams.



4. Close the ink access door.

To clean printhead contacts



NOTE:

- Open the printhead cover and clean printhead contacts only when necessary; for example, if a printhead cannot be detected.

The instructions here are only applicable in this section. After you have set up the printer, do not open the printhead cover unless instructed to do so.

- The cleaning procedure should take only a few minutes. Make sure that the printheads are reinstalled in the printer as soon as possible. It is not recommended to leave the printheads outside of the printer longer than 30 minutes. This could result in damage to the printheads.
- Handle printheads with care. Do not drop the printheads, and do not touch the electric contacts or print nozzles on any surface.

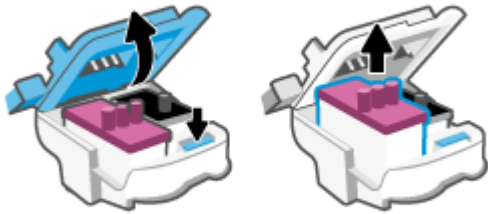
1. Make sure the printer is turned on.
2. Lift the ink access door.



NOTE: After you have set up the printer, do not open the printhead cover unless instructed to do so.

3. Press the blue button to open the printhead cover.

4. Remove the printhead indicated in the error message.



5. Clean the printhead contacts and printer contacts.

- a. Hold the printhead by its sides and locate the electrical contacts on the printhead.

The electrical contacts are the small gold-colored dots on the printhead.



NOTE: Do not touch the electric contacts or print nozzles.



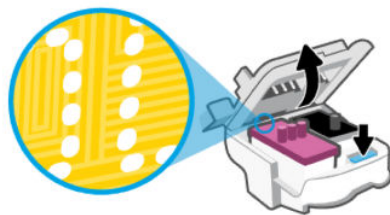
- b. Wipe only the contacts with a dry swab or lint-free cloth.



NOTE: Be careful to wipe only the contacts, do not smear any ink or other debris on the contacts.

- c. On the inside of the printer, locate the contacts for the printhead.

The printer contacts are the set of gold-colored bumps positioned to meet the contacts on the printhead.

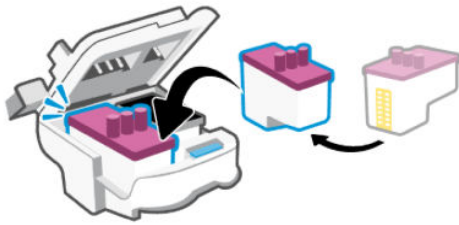


- d. Use a dry swab or lint-free cloth to wipe the contacts.



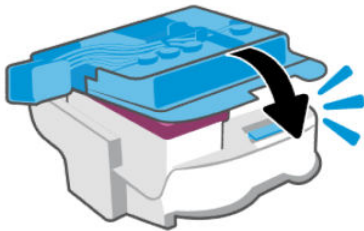
NOTE: Be careful to wipe only the contacts, do not smear any ink or other debris on the contacts.

6. Insert the printhead into the slot until it clicks into place.



7. Close the printhead cover.

Make sure it is properly closed to avoid problems such as carriage jams.



8. Close the ink access door.
9. Check if the error message has gone away.

If you still receive the error message, turn the printer off, and then on.

Printing issues

This topic helps you troubleshoot printing issues.

- Use the [HP Print and Scan Doctor](#) to help diagnose and fix issues automatically.



NOTE: This tool is for the Windows operating system, and is only available in some languages.

- To avoid print quality problems, always turn the printer off using the Power button, and wait until the Power button light goes out before you pull the plug or turn off a power strip. This allows the printer to move the printheads to a capped position, where they are protected from drying out.

To improve print quality, see [Improve print quality](#).

To resolve print issues (Windows)

Make sure that the printer is turned on and that there is paper in the input tray. If you are still unable to print, try the following in order:

1. Check for error messages from the printer software and resolve them by following the on-screen instructions.
2. If your computer is connected to the printer with a USB cable, disconnect and reconnect the USB cable.

If your computer is connected to the printer with a wireless connection, confirm that the connection is working.

3. Verify that the printer is not paused or offline.

To verify that the printer is not paused or offline

- a. Depending on your operating system, do one of the following:
 - **Windows 10:** From the Windows **Start** menu, select **Windows System** from the app list, select **Control Panel**, and then click **View devices and printers** under **Hardware and Sound**.
 - **Windows 7:** From the Windows **Start** menu, click **Devices and Printers**.
- b. Either double-click or right-click the icon for your printer and select **See what's printing** to open the print queue.
- c. On the **Printer** menu, make sure there are no check marks next to **Pause Printing** or **Use Printer Offline**.
- d. If you made any changes, try to print again.

4. Verify that the printer is set as the default printer.

To verify that the printer is set as the default printer.

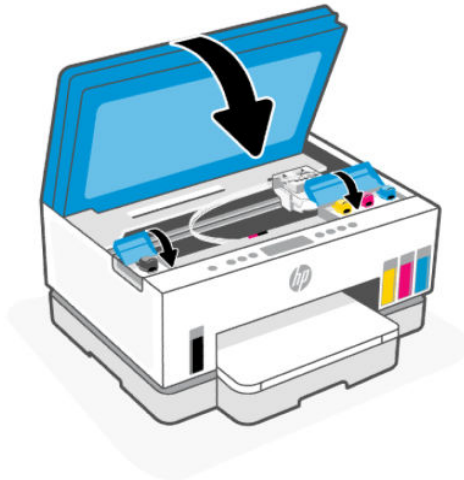

The printer shuts down unexpectedly

- Check the power and power connections.

- Make sure the printer's power cord is connected firmly to a functioning power outlet.

Resolve printer failure

Clean the scanner glass

Dust or dirt on the scanner glass, scanner lid backing, or scanner frame can slow down performance, degrade the quality of scans, and affect the accuracy of special features such as fitting copies to a certain page size.

To clean the scanner glass



WARNING! Before cleaning the printer, turn the printer off by pressing the Power button , and unplug the power cord from the electrical socket.

1. Lift the scanner lid.



2. Clean the scanner glass and lid backing by using a dry and soft, lint-free cloth.
Spray the cloth with a mild glass cleaner and clean **only** the glass.



⚠ CAUTION:

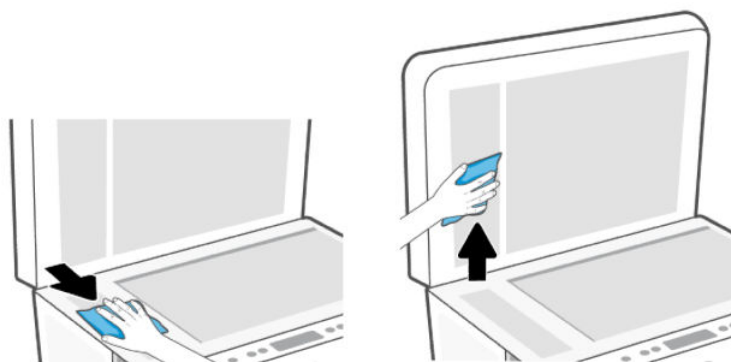
- Do not clean the scanner lid backing with anything wet to avoid damaging the protection layer.
 - Use only glass cleaner to clean the scanner glass. Avoid cleaners that contain abrasives, acetone, benzene, and carbon tetrachloride, all of which can damage the scanner glass. Avoid isopropyl alcohol because it can leave streaks on the scanner glass.
 - Do not spray the glass cleaner directly on the scanner glass. If too much glass cleaner is applied, the cleaner could leak under the scanner glass and damage the scanner.

3. Close the scanner lid, and turn on the printer.

Clean the document feeder glass area (some printer models)

If paper jams keep occurring when using the document feeder, and other means to avoid document feeder jams do not help, try cleaning the document feeder glass area using a dry, lint-free cloth.

1. Lift the scanner lid.
2. Using a dry and soft, lint-free cloth, clean the document feeder glass and the indicated area on the scanner lid.



Clean the exterior

-
- ⚠ WARNING!** Before cleaning the printer, turn the printer off by pressing the power button the Power button , and unplugging the power cord from the electrical socket.

Use a soft, damp, lint-free cloth to wipe dust, smudges, and stains off of the case. Keep fluids away from the interior of the printer, as well as from the printer control panel.

Clean the document feeder (some printer models)

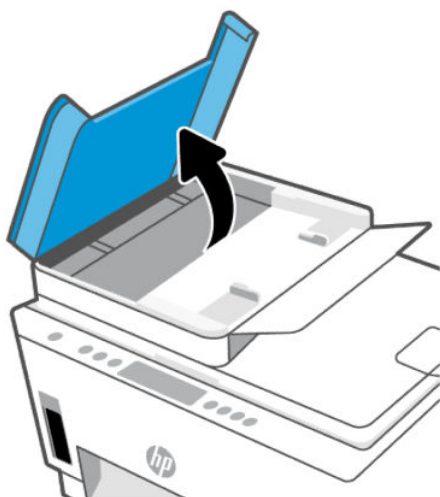
If the document feeder picks up multiple pages or if it does not pick up plain paper, you can clean the rollers and separator pad.

- NOTE:** If you encounter paper jams or poor outcome when copying or scanning using the document feeder, you might need to clean the document feeder glass (some printer models), see [Clean the document feeder glass area \(some printer models\)](#).

To clean the rollers or separator pad

⚠ WARNING! Before cleaning the printer, turn the printer off by pressing the Power button , and unplug the power cord from the electrical socket.

1. Remove all originals from the document feeder input tray.
2. Open the document feeder cover.



This provides easy access to the rollers (1) and separator pad (2).

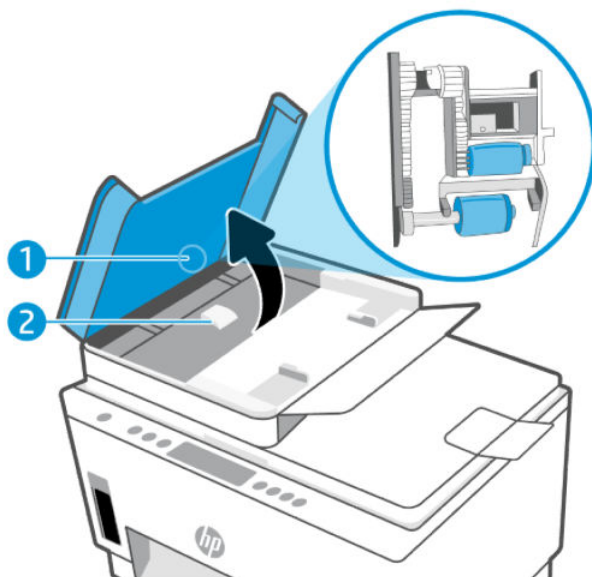

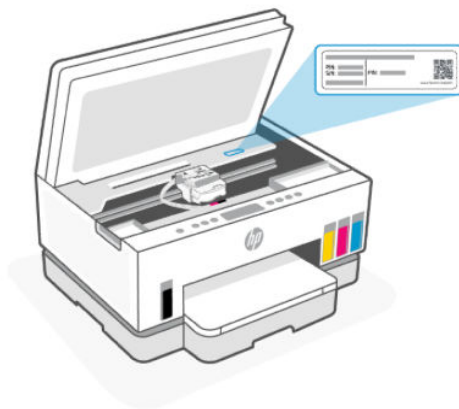

Power Management

Learn how to reduce the power or energy use of the printer.



NOTE: Configuring longer times for these settings or turning off these features will increase energy consumption.

Sleep mode

- Power usage is reduced while in Sleep mode.
- After initial setup of printer, the printer will enter Sleep mode after 5 minutes of inactivity.
- You can change the time the printer goes to sleep after a period of inactivity.
- The Power button light is dimmed and the printer control panel display is off in Sleep mode.
- To wake the printer from sleep, touch anywhere on the printer control panel.

Auto-Off

This feature turns the printer off after 2 hours of inactivity to help reduce energy use. Auto-Off turns the printer off completely, so you must use the Power button to turn the printer back on.

If your printer supports this energy saving feature, Auto-Off is automatically enabled or disabled depending on printer capabilities and connection options. Even when Auto-Off is disabled, the printer enters Sleep mode after 5 minutes of inactivity to help reduce energy use.
